

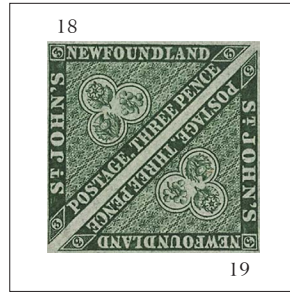

various colours of the one and five pence stamps resulted from re-orders



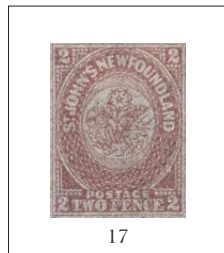

# 1910 JOHN GUY Issue

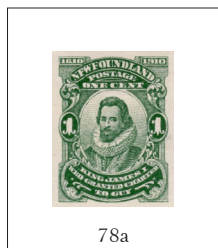

For the Coronation of King George VI in 1937 the British Colonies and Dominions issued a short series of three stamps similar in design, except for the name of the Colony and the denominations



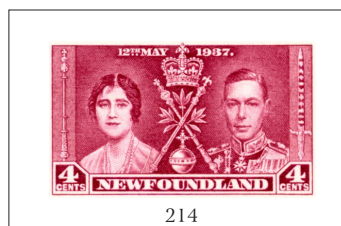

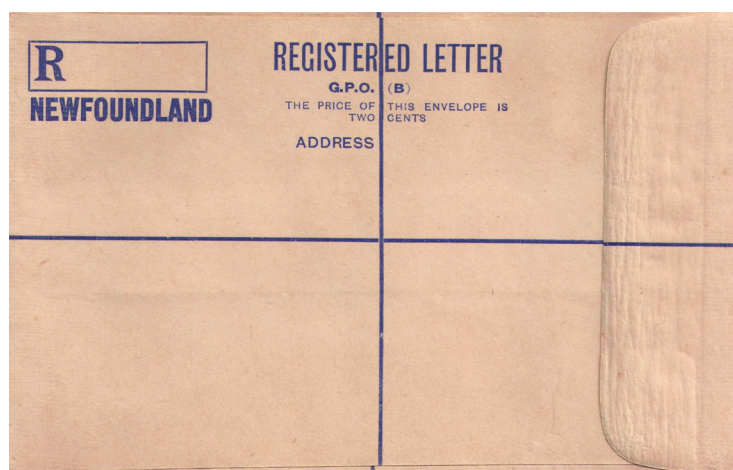
# 1938 REGISTERED ENVELOPE

Newfoundland issued these as unstamped envelopes and charged for them as stationary items



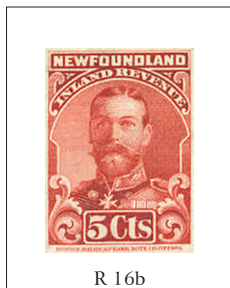
